Copenhagen skating club (SKK) is currently looking for 2 experienced skating coaches to expand our coaching team. SKK is one of Denmark's largest skating clubs, located in the heart of Copenhagen. We offer a new and modern skating rink, with good facilities to support proper training.

As a club, one of our most important club values are to create joy in skating, and social communities both on and off the ice in the world's best skating club.

Your primary tasks

We are looking for a trainer for approximately 37 hours per week, who wants to be part of a dynamic team and has experience with the development of skaters and understands the role of setting a direction for the club in collaboration with the coaches and the board.

We are also looking for a trainer for approximately 30 hours per week, which corresponding to the above position will be part of the coaching team.

Applicable to both positions is that you, as a new coach in SKK, will be part of our skilled and committed coaching team. With reference to SKK's board, the coaches will be responsible for our competition and championship teams as well as partly with the skaters on the Skateschool and Funskate teams.

The trainers will also be responsible for the club's objectives, organization, implementation and evaluation of both ice training and office training (strength, technique and fitness training), just as we expect you to independently solve several organizational and administrative tasks.

Our expectations

You have years of experience as a skating coach and are preferably trained at minimum DIF2 coach level or similar. Or you have the ambition to educate yourself to this level.



It is important that you

- Are able to communicate with all our skaters in Danish or English.
- Preferably have experience with the DSU Age-Related Training Concept (ATK) in Talent and Elite work, or are willing to learn.
- Are warm, welcoming and smiling - even when something is difficult.
- Emphasizes and takes pride in the training being motivating and developing the skaters skills
- Able to see all skaters and give each individual feedback that creates progress, and a desire to learn more.
- Have good ideas for how we can optimize our already well-functioning set-up.
- Have a structured approach to your training and your coaching work - and are well prepared every time you go on ice or have office training.
- Has insight and knowledge about the rules within ice skating.
- Willing to work most days and times, SKK has ice
- Can participate in competitions with the skaters on several weekends during the season.
- Preferably with experience of teaching ice dance (solo), but it is not a requirement.
- Can independently and proactively carry out organizational and administrative tasks such as communication with parents, updating training plans, and other information in our membership system, practical tasks in connection with competition participation, preparation and implementation of meetings, planning camps etc.

In SKK, we value good teamwork and cooperation between coaches and the board. We therefore expect you are willing to put good energy into this.

What do we offer

We offer a good position in a well-organized skating club, where the most important focal point is the joy of skating, and where there is a focus on team spirit and social relations across levels and teams.
